He writes mainly news and background stories, about trade union movement and working life outside of Finland, for Finnish trade union magazines and web sites. Since August 1997 he has been a publisher of the English language web publication Trade Union News from Finland. Artto is a board member of the Union of Journalists in Finland since May 2006.

Natalia Baer is a freelance photographer from Helsinki.


Kirsi Crowley has worked as a freelance foreign correspondent for 15 years, mainly for the Finnish Broadcasting Company YLE radio and TV News and current affairs. She lived and worked as a journalist in London (BBC World Service Finnish Section), South

Africa, Turkey and Pakistan and traveled widely in these regions, where she also reported for magazines. Recently she left freelancing and started working in Finland for a newspaper as a multimedia journalist.

Pekka Hyvärinen is a journalist, writer and media entrepreneur. Hyvärinen is the chairman of the Council of Mass Media (CMM) in Finland.

Anton Hyökki works as a video director and composer in Helsinki. He is a co-founder of Leikki Media Ltd. which provides complete audiovisual branding services. Lately the company has been focusing heavily on online distributed videos.

Klaus Härö is award-winning film director, whose works depict small, weak people who suffer from a loss. His latest film is "Letters to Father Jacob" (2009).



Timo Jaakonaho is a photographer and producer in Lehtikuva Oy since 1987. The 1951 founded Lehtikuva is the largest picture agency in Finland.

Katja Johansson works as a journalist in YLE, the Finnish Broadcasting Company. She has been writing a report by The Journalism Research and Development Centre on the Jokela school killings and is currently working on a graduate thesis on media and school killings.

Heikki Jokinen is freelance-journalist from Helsinki. He writes about culture and copyright issues. He is also the vice president in the Union Council of the Union of Journalists in Finland.

Anni-Kristiina Juuso is actress from Lapland, who has played the main role in the movies like “Käki” (Cuckoo) and “Kautokeinin kapina” (Uprising of Kautokeino). She was rewarded as the best Russian actress in 2002. Right now Juuso is working as a journalist in the Sámi Radio (the Finnish Broadcasting Company) in Karesuvanto, Lapland.

Environmental journalist **Eija Järvinen** from magazine “Ympäristö” (Environment) writes about variant issues concerning environment, also at EU-level.

Anne Karpinen is a Finnish freelance journalist from Tampere. She works for TV, radio and printed media.

Jussi Laitinen is a freelancer environmental journalist. He revealed the toxin scandal in Vuosaari Harbour in Helsinki (Vuosaari is the newest harbour in Baltic Sea) and got the prize for investigative journalism called “Snow shovel” for his journalistic work.

Magnus Londen is a freelance journalist and non-fiction writer from Helsinki. He also hosts Eftersvet, a talk show broadcast on both TV and radio.

Lauri Myllyvirta is known as a campaign worker on energy issues in Greenpeace Finland. He started his first environmental action group at the age of 13. He says he couldn't watch himself in the mirror in the evening if he wouldn't do something to stop the climate change or diminish the threats of nuclear power. He took the bicycle to the seminar!

Hannes Mäntyrinta is an Editor in-chief in Forest.fi joint channel and the Communications Assistant in Finnish Forest Association. He is a man of strong opinions.

Arto Nieminen is Chairman of the Union of Journalists in Finland since 2006. Before his current position, he worked as a political reporter for the Finnish Broadcasting Company.

Photographer and diver **Jukka Nurminen** made a famous exhibition of “Underwater Archipelago”. Exhibition is also the statement against the pollution of the Archipelago between Finland and Sweden. His work has been published worldwide.

Vera Olsson is the producer in Aito Media Ltd. Since 2003, the company has created and produced factual entertainment and talk show series and documentaries for Finnish television. Aito has offices in Helsinki and Tampere, Finland.

Petri Savolainen is the ombudsman in the Union of Journalists in Finland. He specializes on freelance-affairs in the Union.

Panu Rätty is a freelance-journalist from Helsinki writing mainly for magazines. He also trains journalists for example in the University of Art and Design in Helsinki.

Arto Suninen is an economic consultant. He is interested in money: where it comes and where it goes and how it affects the people. He has written more than one thousand financial analyses of the media companies.

Environmental journalist – producer – director **Ismo Tuormaa** started his career as an environmental journalist already in 70's. Tuormaa lives and works in Nurmes, in Northern Karelia in Finland, in the old school he bought and decorated.
